

> The plu–perfe	ect is formed with the auxiliary HAD, followed by the past participle of the main verb:
She had already	wanted to travel in Africa.  y left when Philippe arrived. ok that Corinne had recommended to me.
"already" reinf She learned to l When I got hom	ect shows that the action has been done before another action (in the past). Adverbs such as force this impression.  ove the dog that had bitten her the week before.  ne, I had already heard the bad news.  e all the cookies that their father had bought.
	ect is often used in hypothetical expressions with "if", in conjunction with the past conditional: e come if I had known he was ill.
He had just eate	erb "just", the plu-perfect indicates the immediate past in a past context:  en lunch when I arrived.
